




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


Soil Pile Geometry






Lateral Movement





Test # 1 - 2KPa


ACTUAL ULTIMATE LOAD 250 kN AVERAGE PREDICTION 577 kN





Test # 2 - 15KPa


ACTUAL ULTIMATE LOAD 380 KN AVERAGE PREDICTION 611kN

ACTUAL ULTIMATE LOAD 780 KN AVERAGE PREDICTION 892 kN




